<b>Objective 1.1 - Improve youth experience of safety in their neighborhood.</b>

<b>Strategy 1.2.1 - Create safe routes.</b>	Multiple organizations are working on Safe Routes, including Trenton Public Schools, Capital City Area YMCA, Mercer Street Friends, and the Trenton Police Dept.

<b>Strategy 1.3.1 - Increase police/community initiatives.</b>	The Trenton Police Dept are hosting the Citizens Academy, Take It To The Streets, Trunk or Treat, Police Explorers Program and the TPD Summer Camp.
<b>Strategy 1.3.2 - Implement additional community policing practices.</b>	The Trenton Police Dept has implemented some new strategies to get police onto the streets engaging with community.

<b>Goal 2: Youth engage in meaningful, constructive activities.</b>	
<b>Objective 2.1 - Increase # of youth engaged in meaningful, positive activities and behaviors.</b>	
<b>Strategy 2.1.1 - Develop and maintain city-wide youth program database.</b>	There are multiple organizations working on complementary projects. Collaboration Trenton and Connect Trenton met and will be working together to support the Collaboration Trenton site with a focus on youth. The City of Trenton's WIN App is in progress, which will focus on crisis services for all ages. Trenton Health Team hosts the NOWPOW system, which is designed as a community resource referral platform (not public resource).
<b>Strategy 2.1.2 - Remove transportation as a barrier to youth engagement.</b>	
<b>Strategy 2.1.3 - Review and implement ward-based programs/services.</b>	
<b>Strategy 2.1.4 - Teach positive behavior in schools.</b>	
<b>Strategy 2.1.5 - Increase comprehensive employment programming.</b>	Millhill Child and Family Development Center continues to host the Mayor's Summer Youth Employment Program (approx. 80 youth) and the Mercer County One Stop hosts the Summer Youth Jobs Connection (approx. 100 youth). These programs are planning to meet to discuss collaboration opportunities.
<b>Strategy 2.1.6 - Increase youth civic engagement opportunities.</b>	Next Generation Community Leaders continues to engage youth in community projects (approx 30 youth).
<b>Strategy 2.1.7 - Increase number of non-structured activities.</b>	The Trenton RISE Center and the Take It To The Streets programs are two initiatives that provide non-structured activities.
<b>Objective 2.2 - Increase family engagement in youth activities.</b>	
<b>Strategy 2.2.1 - Improve and leverage school relationships.</b>	Trenton Public Schools and Trenton Police Dept have started working more closely together on youth safety related projects.
<b>Strategy 2.2.2 - Improve coordination of family engagement.</b>	Trenton Public Schools has launched their Parent University programming.

<b>Objective 3.1 - Increase the number of trusted, informed adults in the community and train youth to identify those adults.</b>	
<b>Strategy 3.1.1 - Develop trainings for adults to increase knowledge and build trust.</b>	TCNJ Counseling Dept is hosting free Youth Mental Health First Aid training for adults serving youth in the Mercer County area.
